

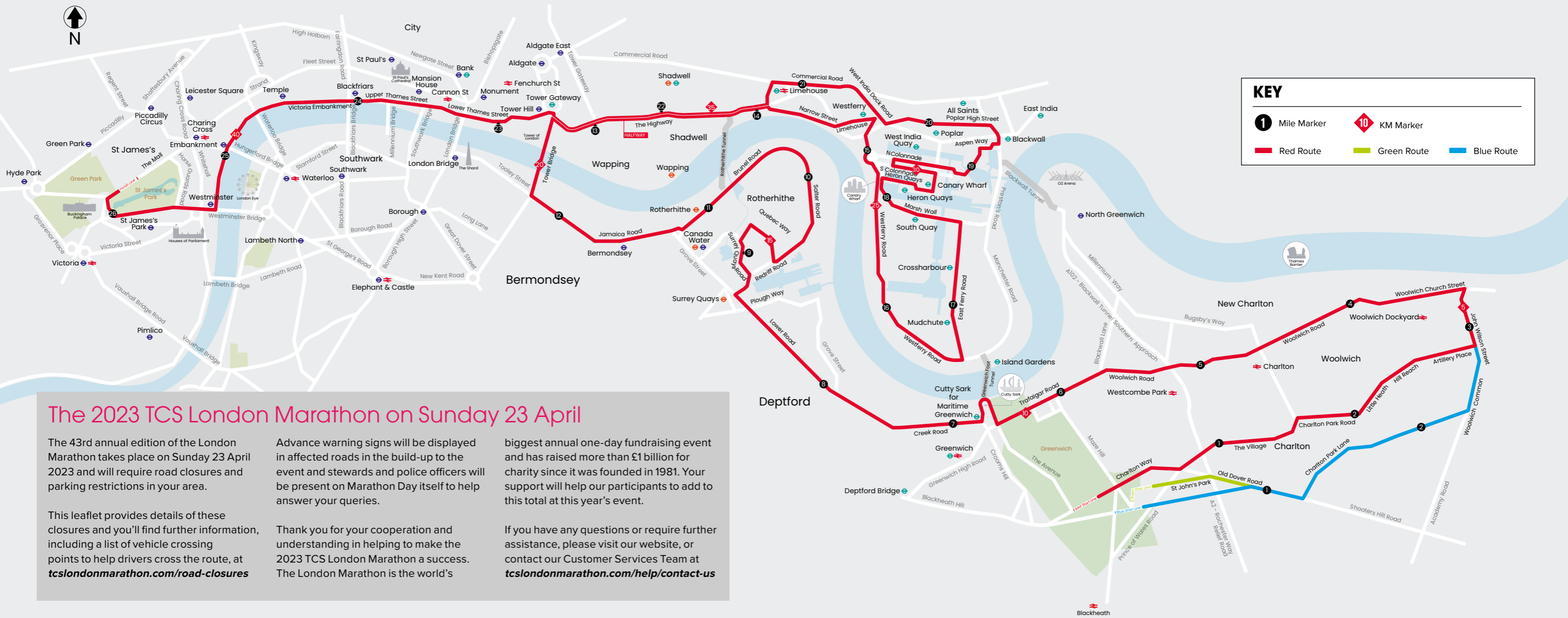

TCS London Marathon Road Closures

Please read this leaflet carefully

Extended road closures in Westminster for the TCS Mini London Marathon and the coronation of King Charles III



The 2023 TCS London Marathon on Sunday 23 April

The 43rd annual edition of the London Marathon takes place on Sunday 23 April 2023 and will require road closures and parking restrictions in your area.

This leaflet provides details of these closures and you'll find further information, including a list of vehicle crossing points to help drivers cross the route, at tcslondonmarathon.com/road-closures

Advance warning signs will be displayed in affected roads in the build-up to the event and stewards and police officers will be present on Marathon Day itself to help answer your queries.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding in helping to make the 2023 TCS London Marathon a success. The London Marathon is the world's

biggest annual one-day fundraising event and has raised more than £1 billion for charity since it was founded in 1981. Your support will help our participants to add to this total at this year's event.

Local information for residents and businesses

ROTHERHITHE

In conjunction with Bacon's College, there will once again be a scheme that will enable residents of the Rotherhithe Peninsula to exit the area while the event road closures are in place.

Bacon's College on Timber Pond Lane will provide a free, secure, overnight parking facility on its premises for use by local residents. The car park will operate from 16:00 on Saturday 22 April until 18:00 on Sunday 23 April. Residents can leave their cars securely parked and return on foot at any time during the road closure period to collect vehicles and exit the peninsula.

From the College, the route out is via Timber Pond Road, Poolmans Street, Needleman Street, Surrey Quays Road and Lower Road. Residents requiring access should use Hawkstone Road, Lower Road, Surrey Quays Road, Needleman Street, Poolmans Street and Timber Pond Road and may leave their cars at Bacon's College until the roads reopen.

WAPPING

Residents of Wapping are affected by the route as it passes along The Highway between miles 13 to 14 and again on the opposite carriageway between miles 21 to 22.

A vehicle crossing point will operate at the junction of The Highway and Glamis Road during the road closure period, allowing entry and exit north and south.

Vehicles will NOT be able to cross while there are participants on both carriageways of The Highway (between approximately 09:30 and 15:30 on Sunday 23 April).

We advise residents travelling on foot to use the pedestrian subway at the junction of The Highway and Glamis Road.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Please assist us by parking your vehicle off the route on the evening of Saturday 22 April.

Vehicle removals will start at 06:00 on Sunday 23 April along the whole route.

If your vehicle is relocated by event contractors, please visit trace.london to find it.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

ISLE OF DOGS

Residents on the east and west side of Westferry Road will be able to exit onto Westferry Road and travel south to Manchester Road until 09:00 on Sunday 23 April. From 09:00 no vehicle movements will be possible until after 16:00.

Event motorcyclists, assisted by stewards, will be available to guide vehicles along Westferry Road when it is safe to do so before 09:00 or after 16:30 only. Drivers will be unable to return to Westferry Road until the roads are fully reopened.

GREENWICH FOOT TUNNEL

The Greenwich Foot Tunnel will be open south to north throughout Marathon Day. However, it will be busy with queues anticipated. The tunnel will be closed north to south between 10:30 and 12:30. Alternative arrangements are in place on the DLR services from Island Gardens.

WESTMINSTER

There will be extended road closures in Westminster as part of the coronation of King Charles III.

The roads listed below will close at the times and dates specified and will all reopen on Thursday 18 May.

The Mall and Marlborough Road will be closed from 05:00 on Thursday 20 April.

Spur Road, Constitution Hill, Horse Guards Road and Bird Cage Walk (eastbound) will be closed from 06:00 on Friday 21 April.

Birdcage Walk will be open for westbound traffic until 07:30 on Saturday 22 April, when it will close.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

TUBE/TRAINS/DLR

London Underground, London Overground and the Docklands Light Railway (DLR) all have extra services on Marathon Day, and they are by far the best way to get around.

Tube services in central areas will be running as usual, but please be aware they may be extremely busy. The Jubilee, Circle and District lines, and DLR, have stops close to the marathon route and are likely to be busier than usual.

BUSES

Buses travelling on roads affected by the marathon will either be diverted or will not run the full length of their route until after the event. To find out more, visit tfl.gov.uk/bus/status

SANTANDER CYCLES

Some Santander Cycles docking stations located on the marathon route will be suspended from Saturday evening until Sunday evening.

RIVER SERVICES

Thames Clippers will be running services from central London to Greenwich Pier, where it's just a short walk to the Start at Blackheath/Greenwich Park. For more information, visit thamesclippers.com

You can watch the action live on the streets of London and on the BBC. Please plan your day carefully and be aware the following areas on the route are always extremely busy: Greenwich town centre, Cutty Sark, Tower Bridge, Canary Wharf, Limehouse and everywhere from Victoria Embankment to the Finish Line on The Mall.
